Registration Process for Internal Clubs

All registration for internally provided clubs (which do not carry an additional cost) will be made via Firefly. The following two groups have been created on Firefly:

- Junior House Hobbies Easter Term 2025
- Senior House Hobbies Easter Term 2025

Staggered Registration

To allow all our boys at St. Anthony's to have a greater opportunity to join an activity they really enjoy, once again we will implement a staggered registration process.

These can be applied for using Firefly.

- 2. The first round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on Monday 18th November at 7:00pm. Parents will be able to make **ONE SELECTION FROM EACH GROUP OF HOBBIES ONLY**.
- 3. The second round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on Tuesday 19th November at 7:00pm. Parents will be able to make a **SECOND SELECTION FROM EACH GROUP OF HOBBIES ONLY**.
- 4. The third round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on Wednesday 20th November at 7:00pm. Parents will be able to make a **THIRD SELECTION FROM EACH GROUP OF HOBBIES ONLY**.
- 5. The final round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on Thursday 21st November at 7:00pm. Parents will be able to select as many options as possible that remain.

Also, spaces are strictly limited to the numbers detailed in the Booklet. No bookings will be accepted after the booking system closes on Friday 22nd November at 3:00pm.



Registration Process for External Clubs

- Please sign up for Externally Provided Clubs using ParentPay. This will be available from Monday 18th November at 7:00pm and close on Friday 22nd November at 3:00pm.
- External clubs will continue to be booked directly through ParentPay and there will be NO STAGGERED BOOKING for these clubs. It will be completed on a first come first served basis.
- PLEASE ENSURE YOU ARE ABLE TO ACCESS PARENTPAY IN ADVANCE.
- PARENTS OF CHILDREN THAT ARE NEW to the school should have been emailed an activation letter, which contains the necessary information to activate their account on ParentPay. They will not be able to book or pay for any items on ParentPay unless their account is activated.

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Arts and Crafts

Anthony will help the boys explore different materials, styles and techniques; they will look at well-known artists and of course they will produce lots of colourful and beautiful pieces of work. Hopefully, it will inspire lots of budding artists!!!

Astronomy

Astronomy club is a place to learn about and discuss the vast expanses of space and the science behind it. Not only will the boys have exposure to the outer reaches of the universe and an extra-curricular bit of physics, but they will be encouraged to take a critical exposure to how we know and understand the things that are beyond our physical reach.

Book Club

The Book Club will have the opportunity to read a wide range of genres of books and take part in thought-provoking discussions, sharing their opinions, questioning aspects of the plot and sharing ideas for future reads. Boys will also share their recommended reading books with other pupils outside the class and in editions of The Patton. A great opportunity for our avid readers to take part in a group activity or just have a nice relax with a good book at the end of the school day!







Chess

Chess is an incredibly beneficial pastime, because playing chess results in better brain function, improved memory and cognitive abilities, strategic thinking and attention improvement.

Lucas and Tony have been coaching chess at St. Anthony's for many year. They have inspired many players over the years and in the Senior House we enter our players in regional competitions and fixtures with other local schools.

Cost: £119 per Term

Choir

The St. Anthony's Choir is for Years 4 and above. Entry is conditional on good attendance. The club takes place on Friday Lunchtime each week. Boys are expected to attend both sessions. The choir will perform regularly at school Mass and concerts.

Coding

In this club we introduce students to text-based coding using JavaScript. Students learn to program by creating fun apps that work on computers and gadgets like phones and tablets. Students will learn about coding fundamentals such as conditional logic, functions, loops and operators, whilst also building visually exciting projects which keeps students engaged throughout the term and excited to develop new projects each week.

Current Affairs and Critical Thinking

Critical thinking is one the most important skills a student must acquire in the 21st century. Over the years, an increasing number of countries have adopted holistic school syllabi for their students to hone these skills in different aspects. Instead of spoon-feeding students, teachers are assigning projects that require them to think creatively and critically to solve problems. We can use a few aspects of critical thinking by reading up on current affairs and trying to understand and evaluate the news so as not to be fooled by misleading headlines, clickbait and fake news online. Richard is very keen to introduce these skills to our boys in Years 5 and 6, not only for the positive impact they will have as they face forthcoming interviews, but as a life skill that could prove invaluable. Beren will be using techniques from the worlds of improv and theatre, to give your pupils the technical and collaborative tools they need to create their own characters, stories, and scenes from scratch!




Debating Society

What are the Benefits of Debating?

- Improved critical thinking skills.
- Pupils acquire better poise, speech delivery, and public speaking skills.
- Increased student retention of information learned.
- Improved listening note-taking skills and increased self-confidence.
- Enhanced teamwork skills and collaboration.

Also, there will be opportunities to compete with other schools in the future.



Fencing

We are very pleased to introduce this exciting new club to our roster of extracurricular activities. Fence Club 43 will be offering classes for all levels (https://www.fenceclub43.com). ALL KIT IS PROVIDED.

Skills are built on week to week, from basic to more advanced skills and tactics later in the term. Sparring is an important aspect of our classes, getting the children to use what they've learned in a match is the best path to improvement and a rich experience for the children.

Geography Society

St. Anthony's geography society is open to years 4, 5, 6, 7, & 8. It will run every Thursday morning with Georgina at 8:15-8:50am. The geography society will be involved in hands-on projects in the local area and regular visits to Hampstead Heath. We will also engage with scenario role-playing, exploring such issues as how the school and the government can respond to the current energy, as well as other activities which involve modelling of the world trade system. You may be subject to the opportunity of joining conferences led by the geographical society but also arranging guest speakers to come to St. Anthony's. This society will enhance your ability to be critical of the world around you and make a difference to your local area and your school.



HIIT

Jonathan, our Director of Sport, will lead this morning workout session. High Intensity Interval Training (HIIT) is a workout based primarily on aerobic exercise that can be done just about anywhere and at any time. 
Italian

Jazz

Tim Doyle will be running Jazz Band is an experienced jazz pianist, guitarist and bassist with a great knowledge of arranging and composing for jazz ensembles. The plan for jazz ensemble this year won't be to force the students to play music from 100 years ago, but to take music that is relevant to the boys in the ensemble and make suitable jazz arrangements for the instruments in the ensemble and teach them how to improvise and play in styles relevant to their tastes. Ear training, improvising and understanding groove and 'jamming' will be at the centre of the ensemble.
